
What is the IDR?

- An annual, state level, self-reported survey about routine childhood immunizations.
- Opens early September and due by November 15th every year
- Assesses immunization coverage and exemption data from the following grades:
 - Child Care/Preschool
 - Kindergarten
 - 6th grade
- Intended to be a representative sample of immunization coverage in Arizona.



Why is the IDR Important?

- How did we get this data? the IDR!
- One of the main factors in determining state and local health department activities in regards to immunizations.
- Helps identify pockets of under-vaccinated students and supports additional measures to assess community vulnerability.
- Parents and any public person can look at each schools immunization rates, particularly when considering enrollment.
 - Example: Immunocompromised child at home so herd immunity is very important for all family members.
- Data is shared with CDC, community stakeholders,
 and community members.



Who Needs to Complete the IDR?

- All licensed child care providers that serve children who are 18 months through
 5 years old.
 - This includes child care centers, home-based providers, Head Start/Early Head Start, preschools, and pre-kindergarten.
- If a facility provides ONLY before and/or after school care for elementary children, they do NOT need to submit an IDR for those grades.

Required per Arizona Administrative Code R9-6-707







Filling out the IDR



Getting Started

- Gather all immunization records for children 18 months through 5 years of age.
 - Age is as of the data you submit your report.
 - You do NOT need to submit information for children younger than 18 months.
- Submit total counts rather than individual children's records.





Getting Started

- You will report the following information by vaccine:
 - ✓ Total # fully immunized

- ✓ Total # catch-up/minimum interval
- ✓ Total # with exemptions on file
- ✓ Total # not in compliance

- You will also report:
 - ✓ Total # of temporary medical exemptions
 - ✓ Total # of permanent medical exemptions
 - ✓ Total # of religious exemptions for one or more vaccines
 - ✓ Total # of religious exemptions for ALL vaccines






Getting Started

• Login (or register) to the IDR web page to the enter the data collected.



Previous IDR Users

- Login with the same email address and password used last year.
- If there is a new email address you must re-register the IDR account.
- If you forgot your IDR password, click "Reset Password".
- NOTE: Sometimes a password may erroneously auto populate with your ASIIS Password; this is NOT your IDR password.





Previous IDR Users: Reset Password


- Proceed to login using your email address and new password.




New IDR Users: IDR Registration

Registration is required for:

- All new IDR account holders.
- Previous users with a new email address.






New IDR Users: Create a Profile

- After clicking Register you will be brought to the page on the right to create your profile and add your school/facility.
- Enter your profile information.
- Select the school in which data will be reported then click the red ADD button.
 - NOTE: You can add multiple schools by repeating this process.
 - If your facility is not listed, fill out the form linked on the homepage.






New IDR Users: Facility Profile

- When you select a facility, the page to the right will appear. Please fill out your principal/director's information (even if that is you) and whether or not your facility has a nurse.
- Complete all the fields in yellow.
- A unique ID number and facility address may auto populate (these are non-editable).
- NOTE: Ensure the correct facility was selected since many facilities have similar names.
- Incorrect or incomplete facility information can be modified by filling out the form linked on the homepage.



Facilities with Private Kindergarten or Higher Grades



 If you selected Yes, you will be asked to select the private grade school from the drop down list.

- If your facility is not listed, check the box "My grade school is not listed"
 - NOTE: This will auto-populate the grade school information.
- Incorrect or incomplete facility information can be modified by filling out the form linked on the homepage.



Home Page: Facility Profile

- There are separate lists for child care/preschool facilities and grade schools.
- If you are not submitting a child care/preschool survey, the child care/preschool list will be blank.
- The Preschool/Child Care/Head Start survey will only be available for schools in your child care/preschool list.
- The Kindergarten and a 6th Grade Survey will only be available for schools in your grade school list.
- Toggle between schools using the red square above the school name.






Home Page: Adding or Removing a School

 Once you login, you can add your schools by clicking the "Add/Remove School" button.

You may need to re-add your school even if you submitted last year.


If needed, this is also how you will add additional schools or remove schools from

your profile.



Multiple Survey Reporters

- Multiple reporters for a school are permissible, however, only one person may work on a survey at a time.
- If someone is already working in the survey you select, you will get a message indicating who is currently working on the survey.
- You are able to see who last edited the survey and when.



Child Care Survey With ≤10 Students


- Reminder: Children under 18 months are not counted in the survey.
- Child care facilities with **10 or less** children between ages 18 months-5 years check the "Yes" box indicating that you do not need to complete a survey.
 - NOTE: if enrollment increases to more than 10 students next year, an IDR survey will be required.
- Click "Submit to ADHS" upon completion of the fields.





Completing the Survey

- Survey in progress will turn from gray to yellow. Submitted surveys will turn green.
- Printable PDFs are available once you have submitted your survey to ADHS.
 - The PDF is for your records only.
 - The printed copy does not need to be sent to ADHS nor will replace the online submission of the survey.
- Modifications can be made to the survey even after a survey was submitted up until November 15th.





Tips for Completing the Survey

Save your work often!

- If logged out due to prolonged inactivity, power failure, or you accidentally exit the application you will LOSE unsaved work.
- Saved work can be revisited at any time upon logging in again.
- Answer each question as accurately as possible.
- Use the resources available on our <u>website</u>

make sure # entered = # enrolled







Arizona Immunization Requirements FAQS



What is the difference between fully immunized and in compliance?

- **Fully immunized** percent of children who have received the <u>required doses</u> for each vaccine type and are up-to-date.
 - Target range is 95% and above
- **Compliance** percent of children who either have an <u>immunization record</u> or a <u>valid</u> <u>exemption</u> on file.
 - Target is **100%**
- ADHS gives out certificates to schools who meet these targets.

Arizona Revised Statutes 15-871 to 15-874 require all students to be vaccinated to be enrolled in school. The law states students are not allowed to attend and can be removed if they fail to attain the required immunizations or a valid exemption.



What is the difference between fully immunized and in compliance?

- For example: In a class of 100 students: 80 are fully vaccinated for MMR, 10 are exempt, and 10 are not exempt but also are not up-to-date.







What does conditional admission, catch-up, and minimum interval mean?

- Conditional admission the student is in process of completing the required vaccinations.
- **Catch-up** children who have had at least one dose, usually late, and are utilizing the minimum interval period before they can receive the next dose. The IDR survey catch-up question does NOT include children who:
 - Have had less than one dose of the vaccine being reported on.
 - Have no record of immunization.
 - Either have an exemption form on file or no exemption on file.
 - NOTE: If someone is choosing not to vaccinate their child they're not in a catch-up scenario.
- Minimum interval the least amount of time required between vaccine doses to be considered valid.

What are the Hepatitis A reporting requirements?

- All preschools/child care facilities in all counties are required to answer the Hepatitis A questions.
- While Hepatitis A is only a child care entry requirement in Maricopa county, ADHS requires the data for analysis and reporting purposes.
- If you are outside of Maricopa county, your responses to Hepatitis A questions will not affect your ability to get a certificate.
- It is not necessary to add a comment in the comment sections about your facility being outside of Maricopa county or that Hepatitis A is not required. This will be reflected when ADHS assesses the data.

While Hep A is not required for child care attendance outside of Maricopa County, every Arizona child care/preschool must answer the following questions.

ASIR 109 Form Update



School Immunization Documentation FAQ

Are students required to show proof of immunization before entering school?

- Yes! Arizona law requires proof of school-required immunizations before a child may enter or attend any Arizona school or child care center. Refer to the <u>Arizona Immunization Handbook</u> for a list of acceptable forms of immunization records for entering school (pg. 21).
- School staff should refer parents without records to their healthcare provider or to their local/county health department. Parents can also request records here or fill out an immunization record request form.





Every year, over 85,000 children are born in Arizona, and all must be immunized against childhood diseases to and future. Our 2020 Healthy People goal is to have 80% of all children receiving the recommended doses of Hib, HepB, varicella and PCV vaccines (4:3:1:3:3:1:4) by age 19-35 months. As of September 2016, the U.S. Nat Immunization Coverage is 74.1%; Arizona 66.7%.
